### **Reading - due Monday, September 14, 2026**

Aim to read 1,200 minutes this summer! Read 20 minutes each day for 60 days and you'll reach your goal. All students entering 7th grade are required to read *The Remarkable Journey of Coyote Sunrise* by Dan Gemeinhart, and the rest of the selections are up to you!

While reading *The Remarkable Journey of Coyote Sunrise*, please think about conflict, the struggle between two opposing forces that characters face in literature. As you have studied, there are several types of conflict; character vs. character, character vs. self, character vs. nature, and character vs. society to name a few. In this story, each character will face their own challenges and obstacles. When you identify the struggle, please mark the pages with a post-it note or annotate your thoughts directly in your book. In September, we will complete a project based on this book.

Please use this [book log](#) to help you keep track of all the titles you read this summer. The book log is due on the first Monday of the new school year - September 14, 2026. Remember to use neat handwriting and write your name. Happy reading!

### **Math - due Monday, September 14, 2026**

#### **IXL Summer Boost **OR** Khan Academy's Get Ready for 7th Grade**

You have the choice between completing IXL 7th Grade Summer Boost or Khan Academy's Get Ready for 7th Grade program. Completion of either will help you review and solidify your understanding of 6th grade math concepts.

#### **Accessing IXL Summer Boost Skill Plans**

1. Use the IXL app or website - [www.ixl.com](http://www.ixl.com)
2. **Log in to your Epiphany account!** You must do this for your teacher to see your completed work
  - Username = first initial last name graduation year@archnewyork  
Ex: Jane Smith, Epiphany Class of 2028 = username: jsmith28@archnewyork
  - Password = epiphany
  - **You will see "Welcome, [Your Name]!" in the upper right corner if you are logged in properly**

3. Go to the Summer Boost Skill Plan (website directions)
  - After you are logged in click Learning at the top of the page, followed by selecting Math.

- In the menu directly beneath the list of subjects, click Skill plans.
  - You will see the Summer Boost skill plan. Select the grade you are entering this fall.

4. You are **not** required to reach a SmartScore of 100. Do your best and complete a minimum of 20 problems in each skill set.

1. Use the Khan Academy app or website - [www.khanacademy.org](http://www.khanacademy.org)
2. **Log in to your Epiphany account using Google (your school email)!** You must do this for your teacher to see your completed work

3. Go to the Get Ready for 7th Grade (website directions)
  - After you are logged in, click Course at the top left of the page, followed by Math: Get Ready Courses. Select the math class you are entering this fall.
  - Complete each unit by watching the videos, completing practice exercises, unit quizzes, and unit tests.
  - *Optional:* Complete the Course Challenge.

4. You are **not** required to reach a score of 100 for each exercise, quiz, and test. Do your best and complete a minimum of 75 percent each.
